

Trillium Hunter Jumper Association North East Region - 2014 OMNIBUS



All competitors and owners are required to become Sports License holder of Equine Canada and to become a member of the Ontario Equestrian Federation. To accumulate points in order to be eligible for zone year end awards and to represent the zone at the Trillium Championships the competitor must be a member of the North East Zone of the Trillium Hunter Jumper Association (THJA). Owners must be THJA members but not necessarily of the North East zone.

Temporary EC sport licenses and horse registration will be available for purchase at each horse show. **Without memberships you will not be allowed to compete at any Trillium Show. Exhibitors competing under temporary licenses and memberships will not be able to accrue points at that show.**

For 2014, competitors and owners showing in the North East Trillium show core classes and divisions must also have at least a **SILVER** Equine Canada Sport License.

Those competitors lacking these memberships must pay the full cost of temporary memberships and horse registration before being allowed to show. For horses without passports a temporary registration must be purchased. No points will be accrued under temporary memberships or horse registrations.

Photocopies of all memberships must be attached to each entry form.
Passports with 2014 Horse License stickers are required for all core Hunter, Jumper and Equitation classes.

New for 2014

- 1) All riders and owners for 2014 North East shows must have Silver level Equine Canada sports license for all core classes in the shows. Shows may choose to offer miscellaneous classes at the Bronze level.
- 2) Equitation classes may remain "Open Card" at the discretion of each show management. It can be much more efficient but it does not work with all show schedules. If an "Open Card" system is to be used, participants must be informed prior to the show date of the set schedule. Riders in Equitation classes must compete with the Horse's number not a separate rider number.
- 3) There will be an Open 2'9" Training Hunter Division (non-core) on Saturday following the Open 2'6" Hunter Division. Modified Child/Adult 2'9" may compete in the Training Hunter Division.
- 4) The previous "Hunter Medal" class is renamed as Junior/Amateur Medal. Eligible Junior and Adult competitors may use this to qualify for the Children's Medal class at the provincial championships.
- 5) It is likely that some shows will run with a single ring and judge both days, others may have a separate jumper and hunter ring on Saturday. Shows may also add other classes to their program. It is the responsibility of the riders and trainers to be aware of the details of shows they plan to enter.
- 6) The high option (3'6") of the Trillium Hunter Division is NOT open to Children's or Adult Amateur Division riders.

- 7) Late entry fees will apply for all shows. For the first show (Woodridge, May 24-25) entries will be considered late if they are not received by Monday May 7, 2012. Entries may be sent in by fax or email. They must be complete with all membership numbers etc. to be considered on time. Copies of membership forms can be handed in at the time of on-site registration. A reminder also that stabling requests must be in two weeks prior to the show. Official Equine Canada Statement

The Trillium Horse Shows are a recognized Provincial Circuit of Equine Canada and are governed by the rules of Equine Canada.

Equine Canada Statement of Principle

Equine Canada (EC), the National Federation of Canada supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

1. Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
2. Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
3. Ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors, and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
4. Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging the routine inspection and consultation with healthcare professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards or nutrition, health comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
5. Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
6. Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices.
7. Requiring owners and trainers to know and follow their sanctioning organizations rules and to work within the industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.
8. Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.

The standards by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Except as specified in this program, every class herein is covered by the Rules and Specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the said rule book. Should any questions arise that are not provided for in the rule book, they shall be referred to the Organizing Committee and their decision will be final. The Organizing Committee reserves the right to refuse entry (of members not in good standing), cancel, postpone or re-schedule any class for conditions they deem reasonable

Medical/Vet scratches – to qualify for a medical (rider) or vet (horse) scratch you and/or the horse must be on site and on the judge's card. You must provide the organizing committee with appropriate documentation concerning the reason for the withdrawal of the entry.

The Organizing Committee shall comprise: the judge, steward, course designer and the show manager.

All Core Trillium Circuit classes; The following are **Core Level** Divisions and classes; Open 2'6" Hunter, 2'6" Children's/Amateur Hunter, Low Hunter, Trillium Hunter (Low/High), Adult Amateur Hunter, Children's Hunter 3', Children's Medal, Pony Hunter (Small, Medium and Large), Short Stirrup Hunter, Modified Child/Adult 2'9" Hunter, Modified Junior/Amateur Hunter, Hack, Open 0.90 m Jumper, Open and Child/Adult 1.0 m Jumper, Trillium Jumper, Trillium Jumper Medal, Modified Child/Adult Medal, , Adult, A, B, and C Equitation. Participants in any of these must be paid up members of the Ontario Equestrian Federation and must have at least a SILVER Equine Canada sport license. All horses used in any core Hunter, Jumper and Equitation classes must have a current, up-to-date passport with a 2014 license sticker. Horses in Hack Division do not need passports. For exhibitors to accrue points you must be a member of the THJA (NE region), horse owners must be THJA members though not necessarily in NE zone.

All other divisions and classes are miscellaneous. Competitors riding in **miscellaneous** divisions and classes must be members of the Ontario Equestrian Federation and must also have the appropriate Equine Canada sport license. If you wish to accrue points towards year-end awards you must also be a member of THJA (NE region).

The Person Responsible is the individual responsible and accountable for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse. The Person Responsible may be the trainer or may be an owner, rider, driver, agent or coach. The Person Responsible must be an adult and must hold an EC individual or group license (see A203.5).

Stabling requests must be in writing and made 2 weeks prior to each show. Stall fees are non-refundable and all fees must be paid to remain in good standing.

- 1) Cost of stabling is to be consistent at each facility, but each show may set its own stabling cost.
- 2) Cost of bedding may be an additional cost.
- 3) Stabling will only be on a per event basis. There will be limited stabling available, not necessarily on the show grounds and this only if the secretary is contacted early.
- 4) For the first show of the season the deadline for on-time entries will be the Monday prior to the show weekend and the late entry fee will be \$25. For all following shows, competitors showing on Saturday must submit their entries at the show office by 7:00 p.m. on Friday. Competitors showing on Sunday must submit their entries by 4:00 p.m. Saturday. Failure to comply with these deadlines will result in a \$5/division post entry fee. Competitors are encouraged to fax or email their entries at least one week prior to each event. Stabling requests must have been submitted two weeks in advance. Riders may declare their divisions when they arrive on the show grounds on Friday (by 7:00 p.m.) or Saturday (by 4:00 p.m.) or they will be charged an additional \$5/division.
- 5) All entry forms **MUST BE COMPLETE** to be considered on-time, with proper signatures, complete addresses, EC/OEF/THJA numbers for owners and rider(s) and passport numbers for horses. Proof of memberships and passports must be presented at the time of registration. Failure to produce these will result in disqualification. Competitors under 18 years of age must have a parent's or guardian's signature on their entry form. As a result of new helmet regulations, parent and/or legal guardian signatures only are acceptable. Coaches cannot sign for their riders unless they are their legal guardian. To avoid disappointment, pre-register with parent/guardian's signatures ready.
- 6) We cannot sell EC Silver sport licenses, but we can sell temporary memberships for the show, BUT no points will be awarded. Competitors may show in two different zones but it must be with different mounts. THJA memberships must be purchased for each zone competed in.
- 7) A photocopy of all memberships and licenses should be attached to your entry for each show unless already on file with the show office.
- 8) Entries must be accompanied by either cash (in full) or by an open cheque at the time of entry.
- 9) If proof of membership is not provided, competitors will be able to compete only after completion of all appropriate membership forms and deposit of a cheque(s) for the full amount of all memberships.
- 10) Entry fee refunds must be authorized by the Organizing Committee and/or a veterinarian.
 - a) Cancellation of the entire competition as per General Regulations A308. All entries and fees paid must be refunded entirely within 30 days. Cancellations made due to extraordinary circumstances (e.g. natural disasters, storms, accidents or emergencies) will be addressed on a case by case basis with Equine Canada
 - b) In the event that a class or the remainder of a class is cancelled and cannot be rescheduled within the duration of the competition, the exhibitor will be reimbursed the class fee.
 - c) A competition receiving written confirmation from a competitor of cancellation of their entry before the closing date will refund the competitor 100% of class fees paid, except the administration fee set by the competition and applicable stall reservations as identified in the prize list, which may be retained by the competition organizer. Fees collected on behalf of other organizations or entities (including, but not limited to: drug fees, discipline levies and temporary fees) must be returned to competitors.
 - d) Each prize list must contain the cancellation and refund policy of the organizers. Fees collected on behalf of other organizations or entities (including, but not limited to: drug fees, discipline levies and temporary fees) must be returned to competitors in the case of competition cancellation.
 - e) Competition management must refund any entry fees, stabling and administration fees exempted, paid in advance by an exhibitor for any horse(s) which is subsequently named to an official Canadian Equestrian Team participation on which will prevent him/her from competing in that competition.
 - f) Credits and refunds. Refunds may be offered in the form of a credit towards entry at a future competition of the same organizing committee on a dollar for dollar basis, if acceptable to the competitor. Credits may be offered by the competition as a choice to the competitor, but may not be the sole option.
- 11) The Judge's decision is final.

- 12) Age divisions are as follows: note – the age of a rider on January 1 of the current year will determine the rider’s classification for the entire following year.
Adult (Senior) from the beginning of the calendar year you turn 19. (For 2014 born in 1995 or earlier)
Junior “A” from the beginning of the calendar year in which you reach the age of 16 to the end of the year in which you turn 18. (For 2014 if born in 1996, 1997, 1998)
Junior “B” from the beginning of the calendar year in which you reach the age of 13 to the end of the year in which you turn 15. (For 2014 if born in 1999, 2000, 2001)
Junior “C” until the end of the year in which you turn 12 (For 2014 born in 2002 or later.)
- 13) All riders must wear approved protective headgear secured with a safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet at all times while riding anywhere on the competition grounds at all Equine Canada sanctioned competitions.
- 14) All Junior competitors must wear approved head gear with harness fastened for the jog.
a) Approved headgear meets the ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials) standards and Displays the SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) seal. The British Standard BSI, is also acceptable.
- 15) Senior riders entering into Amateur classes must possess a current EC amateur card.
- 16) Ponies may only be ridden by Junior riders. Junior ‘A’ riders may only ride “A” (large) ponies
- 17) Adult Amateur riders may ride “A” ponies in Adult Amateur classes. May not be ridden by a Junior at the same competition.
- 18) Protests must be made within 48 hours of the occurrence, to the secretary or the Organizing Committee.
- 19) Protests must be in writing, signed and with a \$100.00 deposit. The deposit will be refunded if the protest is upheld.
- 20) In Hunter Divisions, competitors must complete at least one Over Fences Class to be eligible for the corresponding Hunter Under Saddle Class. When jogging a junior must jog a junior horse and similarly an amateur must jog an amateur horse (article G401.6).
- 21) Without proof of amateur status an adult may not compete in divisions restricted to amateur or junior/amateur riders. Amateur status should be applied for when applying for an EC membership.
- 22) Hors Concours entries. Once a horse has shown hors concours, it may not compete in any other event in the same ring on the same day. Hors concours entries are not permitted in Hunter Divisions (article G401.7). Hors Concours entries are permitted at the discretion of the organizing committee in the jumper divisions (article G501.2).
- 23) At the discretion of the Organizing Committee, competitors may be required to ride the over fences portion of the hunter division back-to-back.
- 24) Championship points for the divisions to which they apply will be available at the secretary’s booth. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded after each division.
- 25) All dogs on the show grounds must be kept under control, preferably on a leash.
- 26) Proof of a negative Coggins test may be requested by each show facility but if not specified it is only a recommendation. Proof of Coggins is up to the individual shows.
- 27) **Motorized Vehicles:** The use of motorized vehicles (ATV,s, motorbikes, etc., is restricted to licensed operators ONLY and may, at the discretion of the show management, be restricted entirely on the show grounds.
- 28) **Eligibility in the miscellaneous divisions:**
a) **Beginner Division:** Open to horse/rider combinations not showing at more than 2’ at the current show.
b) **Pony Pleasure Hack** – any pony ridden by a Junior rider.
c) **Child/Adult 2’6” Medal Class** (non-core) Governed by the same specifications as the Modified Child/Adult 2’9” Medal Class.
d) **Training Hunter Division-** (non-core) Riders in this Division may cross-enter into the Modified Child/Adult 2’9” Hunter Division and the Modified Child/Adult 2’9” Medal Calss
e) **Other Miscellaneous Classes** – as specified by show management in the program
